To my surprise this is not the case - this book is a reprint of a book copyrighted in 1950. The book is interesting and seems to contain a lot of information but is of no use to anyone looking for information on modern firearms and accessories such as laser designators, etc. If I had known the actual time period this book was written in I would not have bought it. I think I'll keep it as it interesting to learn about methods, materials and firearms of the the mid-twentieth century to satisfy my curiosity but as far as usable information I have yet to find much. Another negative I have noticed in reading portions of the book is there is little detail on many of the operations mentioned. For example, I was interested in checkering and looked at what I could find in the book. Some tools were drawn but not well-dimensioned. The technique itself wasn't explained and there were no useful photos of work in progress or finished work.The bottom line is it should be

It doesn't have much of anything that will help with modern firearms (AR's, or anything with polymer) but has loads of information on working on traditional firearms and making your own tooling to work on them (I don't like buying a specialized tool just to work on 1 or 2 guns).
