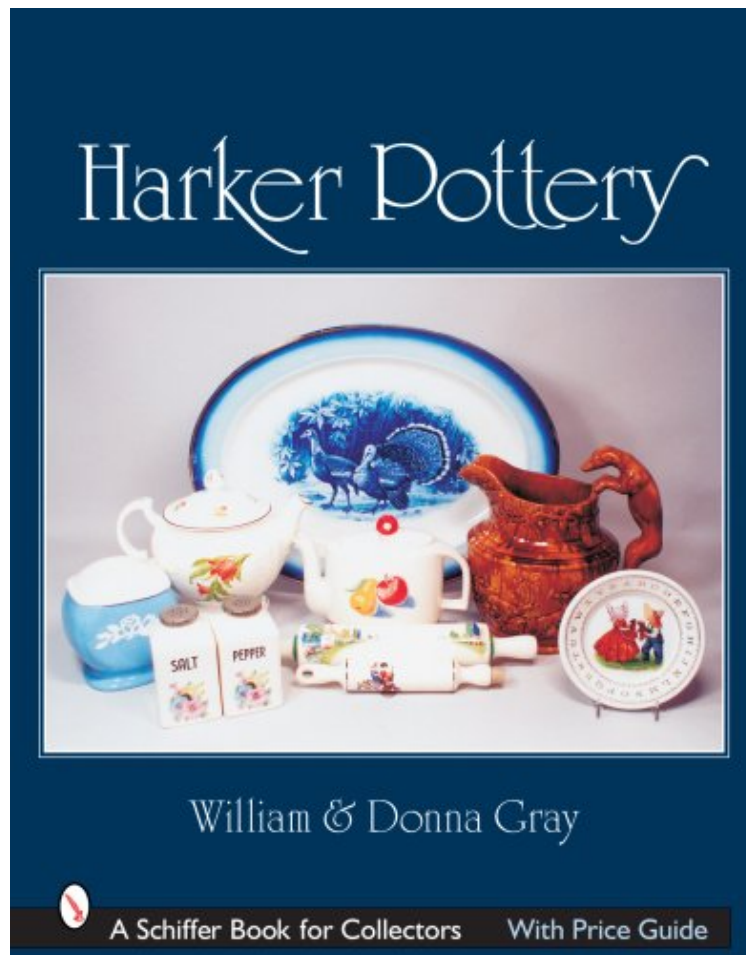

The authors have compiled the most exhaustive collection of Harker backstamps in existence as well - over two hundred of them, compared with dozens found in earlier books. For anyone interested in the rise and fall of one American company from the early years in the mid 19th century through the latter half of the 20th, this is a wonderful book. It will also be a great book for all interested in the changing tastes of the American consumer during the same time period. Decorations include Flow Blue and a wide variety of popular decals.
